

La Crosse Neighborhood Gardens



Northside Elementary, Fire Station #4, North Community Library, and Logan High School are the four locations for the Seeding a Legacy of Healing grant provided by Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. These locations demonstrate raised bed, container, and urban community gardens. Come and visit to learn how to grow and make something out of nothing, reduce waste, reuse, and recycle household items to help your gardens flourish.



The City Hall Garden and the Hogan Administration site is planted and maintained by the community. A variety of vegetables are grown for anyone who would like food. Volunteers meet weekly to take care of the garden. If you are interested in helping, call 608-315-2693.



The Aptiv Community Victory Garden is located just north of Aptiv's main building at 3000 South Avenue. The gardens provide exercise and vegetables for Aptiv clients and staff and for the whole community. Volunteers help plant, weed, and harvest, often along with the Aptiv garden class. The usual weekly volunteer time is Friday morning (exact time depends upon weather). Volunteers are very welcome. Please email or call.

The Kane Street Community Garden is a program of The Hunger Task Force. The goal is to introduce better nutrition to the La Crosse community. The Kane Street Community Garden grows on average 30,000 pounds of organic produce every year. Items grown at the garden are distributed for free on Harvest Days. Harvest days are Mondays & Thursdays at 5:00 pm and Saturdays at 1:00 pm. Volunteers are welcome anytime during our open hours. Stop on over, we'd love to see you and no prior experience needed!
